

## 1. APPLYING FOR FINANCIAL AID

---

- Create a Federal Student Aid (FSA) ID with the United States Department of Education at <https://studentaid.gov/fsa-id/create-account/launch>. *Both student and parent need an FSA ID.*
- Complete the **2023-2024** Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [www.studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa](http://www.studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa), include **USC Aiken school code 003449**, and use the **IRS DRT** to transfer federal tax information.
- USC Aiken** will download **2023-2024** FAFSA. Check your **USC Aiken email** and **Self Service Carolina (SSC)** for notification stating USC Aiken has received your FAFSA. (If completing the FAFSA after January, students will receive an email 5-7 business days after submitting the application.)
- View your financial aid award status and any outstanding requirements.
  1. Log into **Self Service Carolina** at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Financial Aid** tab
  3. Select the **Eligibility** block
  4. From the “Select Campus” dropdown, select USC Aiken and click Continue
  5. From the “Select Aid Year” dropdown, select USC Aiken 2023-24 and click Submit
  6. Review for any **Unsatisfied Requirements**

## 2. COMPLETING SC SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS – SC RESIDENTS ONLY

---

SC residents who meet the requirements to receive the SC HOPE Scholarship, SC LIFE Scholarship, Palmetto Fellows Scholarship, or SC Need-based Grant must sign the State Scholarship/Grant Certification each year in order to receive the fund. The certification outlines the general eligibility requirements and renewal requirements of the fund.

- Sign Terms and Conditions for **State Scholarship/Grant Certification**:
  1. Log into your **Self Service Carolina** account at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Financial Aid** tab, select **Financial Aid**, then **Financial Aid for Aid Year**
  3. From the “Select Campus” dropdown, select USC Aiken and click Continue
  4. From the “Select Aid Year” dropdown, select USC Aiken 2023-24 and click Submit
  5. Select the **Terms and Conditions** tab, then Agree or Disagree
  6. If you agree, select the **Accept Award Offer** tab
  7. Accept the award and **Submit Decision**

## 3. ACCEPTING YOUR FINANCIAL AID

---

Once USC Aiken has received your FAFSA and all requirements have been completely satisfied, the Financial Aid Counselors will package your financial aid.

- View and accept your financial aid:
  1. Log into your **Self Service Carolina** account at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Financial Aid** tab, select **Financial Aid**, then **Financial Aid for Aid Year**
  3. From the “Select Campus” dropdown, select USC Aiken and click Continue
  4. From the “Select Aid Year” dropdown, select USC Aiken 2023-24 and click Submit
  5. Select the **Award Overview** tab to view awards
  6. Select the **Accept Award Offer** tab to accept awards
  7. Accept/Decline awards and click **Submit Decision**
    - *You can accept a partial amount, accept the full amount, or decline.*

- If you choose to accept Federal Direct Student Loans, you must complete a **Master Promissory Note (MPN)** and **Entrance Counseling**. Go to <https://studentaid.gov/>, use your FAFSA login information to complete these loan requirements under the **Complete Aid Process** tab.
  - *When you have completed your **MPN** and **Entrance Counseling**, allow 24-48 hours for the system to update your account. Loans will not disburse until the week before classes begin.*
- Complete the **Title IV Fee Authorization**:
  1. Log into your **Self Service Carolina** account at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Financial Aid** tab
  3. Select **Award**, then **Award for Aid Year**
  4. From the “Select Campus” dropdown, select USC Aiken and click Continue
  5. From the “Select Aid Year” dropdown, select USC Aiken 2023-24 and click Submit
  6. Click on the **Resources/Additional Information** tab, and then choose Agree/Disagree

## 4. COMPLETING LEGAL STATE RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

---

### For South Carolina Residents:

All new students who are residents of South Carolina must complete the Residency Certification Form to confirm residency status. Until the Residency Certification Form is completed, students are considered non-residents and will be charged out-of-state tuition rates.

- Complete your **SC Residency Certification Form**:
  1. Log into your **Self Service Carolina** account at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Admissions** tab, then **Residency Certification Form**
  3. Select **USC Aiken**
  4. Under **Start a New Certification**, complete for the correct term

### For Legal Residents of Richmond County or Columbia County, Georgia:

Legal residents of Richmond County or Columbia County, Georgia, may qualify to pay in-state tuition rates per the Registrar’s determination. If you believe you may qualify, complete the Residency Certification Form as outlined below, and answer **Yes** to the **Reciprocity Agreement** question.

- Complete your **SC Residency Certification Form**:
  1. Log into your **Self Service Carolina** account at: <https://ssb.onecarolina.sc.edu/>
  2. Select the **Admissions** tab, then **Residency Certification Form**
  3. Select **USC Aiken**
  4. Under **Start a New Certification**, complete for the correct term
  5. Be sure to answer **Yes** to the **Reciprocity Agreement** question

## 5. ADDITIONAL OPTIONS

---

- Business Services Payment Plan** - An option for paying tuition, fees, and on-campus housing charges through regularly scheduled payments. More information and enrollment details are online at <https://www.usca.edu/business-services/payments/payment-plans>.
- Apply for a Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students (PLUS)** - A credit-based loan from the Department of Education that a parent can apply for to help supplement their student’s financial aid offer. - Apply for a Private Educational Loan** – A credit-based loan offered by a private bank or credit union that can supplement your financial aid offer. Most students will need a credit-worthy cosigner to be approved.
